Identity Theft 60-second PSA

Identity theft is a fastest-growing crime. To reduce your chances of becoming a victim, the CPCU Society [chapter name] Chapter, reminds you to:

- Be aware of your surroundings when using an ATM, a public telephone or your cell phone. Criminals can make off with important numbers by looking over your shoulder, or listening while you give out a credit card number to reserve a hotel room or rent a car.
- Do not give out personal information if you receive an unsolicited call. For example, if an alleged bank representative calls you asking for account verification, it is probably a fraudulent call.
- Install anti-virus software and a firewall to make the information on your computer more secure.
- Shred papers with personal or financial information before putting them in the trash, including credit card and loan applications, cancelled checks, and documents containing Social Security numbers.
