



Membership Payback Calculation

Example:

Property-casualty insurance agent licensed in the State of Texas and residing in Dallas.

Texas requires **30 hours** of continuing education credits (including 2 hours of ethics) every two years.

Assume:

The individual completes his or her CE requirements in the last of the two years allowed.

The individual maximizes the CE credits offered at the CPCU Society Annual Meeting & Seminars. (The 2011 Annual Meeting schedule as of Sept. 8, 2011 is used for the purposes of this calculation). Further, it is assumed that the state of Texas approves all Annual Meeting seminars filed for CE credit.

Remaining CE credits are earned through local workshops. Prices reflect "typical" workshop pricing for the listed topics in the third quarter of the 2011 CY.

Travel and lodging expenses are excluded.
